Lauren found inspiration in the words of Oscar Wilde, "Where your life leads you, you must go," and she wholeheartedly embraced this advice as she did life itself. All in her orbit agreed, this talented, driven young woman was heading to the stars, and destined not only to achieve high standing, but also brighten the places wherever her life's pursuits took her. Even when obstacles cropped up in her path, none deterred her, not even epilepsy. Always an excellent student who earned high honors, Lauren graduated Hamden High School, and she received an undergraduate from McGill University in Montreal. She was working on earning her MBA at the time of her death. The inquisitive, sharp and agile intellect that led Lauren to excel in academics also served her well in her professional life. She worked in the biomedical field after graduating university. She was working as a Account Manager for Bio-Chem Fluidics, a job she loved. Lauren was a devoted and beloved daughter, granddaughter, cousin and niece, and friend. She was like an older sister to her younger cousins, all of whom she adored and loved her back equally.
