Adolph A. DiChello "Dolph" 83, beloved husband of Eileen Carey DiChello for 54 years, entered into rest April 3, 2011. Born in New Haven on August 18, 1927 son of the late Stephen and Olympia Limauro DiChello. He was predeceased by his brother, Seamen William J. DiChello, killed in action in WWII. Dolph was a career educator spending 35 years in public school in the town of North Branford as a teacher and administrator. Later, 10 years in a private school, Hebrew Day Academy in charge of English studies. He held a 6 year degree in administration from the University of Connecticut. Early in his career Dolph was hired during the summer to set up a recreational program for the American foreign staff of Standard Oil on the Island of Aruba. He was a life member of the Carmel Council of the Knights of Columbus and a 4th degree Knight of the Commodore John Barry Assembly of Hamden. Dolph was a chartered member of the WWII Memorial in Washington D.C. He is survived by his wife Eileen Carey DiChello and his children Eileen P. DiChello, Stephen G. DiChello and William DiChello, his sister Theresa Proulx of Madison, his grandchildren, Steven and Paul Zion, Michael and Anthony DiChello, Ryan, Robin, Alex and Chloe DiChello, Stephanie, Stephen Jr. and Victoria DiChello. He was an avid hiker, enjoyed landscaping and traveled the world with his beautiful wife. He died peacefully at home surrounded by his family.
