February 15, 1948 - June 8, 2017

Daniel Ford, 69, of Hamden passed away on June 8th, 2017 after a lengthy illness. He is survived by his beloved wife Josephine Cacioppo Ford, his sons David Ford of Hamden and Jeffrey Ford and his wife Kelly of North Haven, grandchildren Lila, Mia, Kaydence and Maddox, brothers Harold Ford of Bar Harbor ME, John Ford of Cheshire and Thomas Ford of Cheshire. Also survived by several nieces and nephews. He was born Feb. 15, 1948 in New Haven a son of the late John and Mary Pisarczyk Ford, was a graduate of Hamden High School class of 1965 and Quinnipiac College from where he earned a B A Degree in Math in 1970. Dan was a gifted baseball player and was a member of the Hamden High Class LL State Championship team and in 1966 was drafted in the first round by the Cleveland Indians but since he was only 17 he could not sign a pro contract. He went on to play at Quinnipiac and was a part of the NAIA New England Championship Teams in 1966 and 1968. He was then drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals and played for them for four years before being traded to the Minnesota twins,. He was a sheet metal worker for many years as a member of Local #40 and was the former owner of The Valley Hitting Club in Seymour where he gave hitting and pitching lessons. Besides playing baseball he coached teams in the Hamden Fathers Little League and Babe Ruth League and the American Legion Post 150 Team from Hamden. Dan also served with the Army National Guard. He was inducted into the Quinnipiac Hall of Fame in 1982 , the Hamden High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005 and the Southern CT Diamond Club in 2013. He

was a past recipient of the Hartford Twilight League MVP award and the Gold Bar award from the West Haven Twilight League.

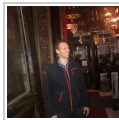

“ Years ago, when we were young kids, my brother and I used to walk down to the Ford house on Birchwood Drive to play football, baseball, or board games. Three things invariably happened when we arrived: first, Mr. Ford (Dandy Dan) would call out to us, "Boy, is it Halloween or are you wearing a mask today?" and we would instantly crack up. The second is that Mrs. Ford would at some point make us sandwiches while we played sports for hours on end. The third was that Mr. Ford -- quiet, stoic, a man of action, not of words -- would be walking around outside the house, making improvements and additions that to this day seem impossible for a layman. He would be fixing a car, installing a window, working on the roof, or doing some other thing that would be hard for a team of professionals to do much less one man. And yet the Ford house always seemed immaculate and perfectly constructed, and it was Mr. Ford who must have done so much of the work of building it -- how? It boggles the mind. I also can remember the sound, every night, of Mr. Ford throwing baseballs to Dave and Jeff and hearing the swing of their bats and the crack of the ball even up the street. And I'll always remember the exceptional detail that Mr. Ford used a screwdriver, not a key, to start his pick-up truck, yet another sign of his great ingenuity. But he was not a braggart, just a humble, hard-working, quietly brilliant man who raised a great family. I think they don't make them like Dandy Dan Ford anymore. I send my deepest condolences to the Ford family and I am so sorry he is gone; he will be sorely missed by all I'm sure. 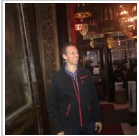
