



Frances Q. Grindell

October 30, 1938 - March 14, 2015

Frances Quinlan Grindell age 76, died at Arden Courts Manor Care Health Services on March 14, 2015. Frances passed peacefully surrounded by family and friends after a two year battle with the effects of advanced Alzheimer's and related stroke injury.

Born October 30, 1938 in New Haven, CT to Frank and Thelma Quinlan, she attended East Haven High School and graduated in 1956, Boston University graduating in 1960 with a BA in nursing and Southern Connecticut State University in 1993 with a Master . On May 6, 1961 she married Francis K. Grindell.

She resided in Hamden and worked at Yale New Haven Hospital until retiring in 2004. She returned to Yale working as an educator for the Nursing Education program conducting PCA training until her stroke in April of 2013.

Frances will be especially remembered for her passion as an educator, caregiver, mother, grandmother and friend to all who knew her.

Survivors include her son Mark (Joan) Grindell of Hamden, daughter Beth Ann (William) Spargo of Coventry and grandchildren Emily and Aleah Grindell of Hamden. Her sister, Mary Quinlan of East Haven.

Funeral Services will be held Friday at 10 a.m. in Mount Carmel Congregational Church, 3284 Whitney Ave. Hamden. Burial to follow in St. Lawrence Cemetery, West Haven.
