“ Joe had a generosity of spirit. It was his desire to do what needed to be done and share whatever he could in supporting those he loved. Whether it was giving of his time to assist with tasks, like walking the dog or lending a hand, or buying a meal for friends and family at his favorite seafood spot, Joe wanted to be there to connect with those he loved.

Joe was quick with a joke. He had a vast repertoire of jokes and whimsical stories he carried up his sleeve. Being a bit shy in new or difficult situations, Joe often used levity and humor to diffuse tension or just make somebody laugh or smile, always with the purest of intentions. He also had an arsenal of tongue twisters that he shared with us, his nieces and nephews, as children. We could never get enough.

Joe had a positive outlook. He did not complain or blame others, even when he may have been sad or hurting. When faced with darker days, and there were those that were challenging, and even heartbreaking, Joe kept a stiff upper lip and attempted to rise above, expressing himself with kindness and a happy lilt in his voice. He was a glass half full kind of guy.

Joe was an amazing uncle. When I think back to the earlier days of my childhood, and family vacations spent with Uncle Joe, I remember the unwavering attention and time he spent with us, the kids. Again, the generosity and the humor were ever present. When the other adults were mingling with each other, Joe was entertaining us. He spoiled us and made us feel so incredibly special. I still think of the silliest of tongue twisters, to this day, that made us all laugh hysterically, once someone said it wrong. It was, in fact, quite a struggle to say, "Three smart fellows, they felt smart" ... "3 times fast", without stumbling on the words. It was also hilarious!

Most notably, and above all else, Joe was a pure soul, who exuded a sort of gentle, enduring innocence. (As a side note, I think this is why animals and children loved Joe. They perceive energy far more

strongly than adults, and find comfort in those whose energy is warm & gentle). That said, I sometimes felt like Joe should have been born in another place and time, when things were simpler, and the world was not as jaded. Joe enjoyed the ease of simpler things...sharing an amazing Pizza with family, receiving a wet kiss from a pup, the solitude of Sunday Mass, a slice of a good blueberry pie, a visit with his sister or brother, or just chatting about a golf game. Once, when I brought up Joe's gentle nature to my father, he became emotional, wiping tears from his eyes, and said "That is exactly it", "Joe is a pure soul". As such, my father felt fiercely protective of his little brother, loving him so deeply and unconditionally, as only a big brother could. I take comfort in the belief that they have now reconnected beyond this earthly plane. Perhaps, Pete even helped usher Joe to the other side. At least, I'd like to think so.
