Joe spent many treasured moments traveling, but his special love were the trips to VT where he cherished the feeling of inner peace. Joe was up for any adventure, whether it be a trip to Broadway, Tuscany, a cruise or a family vacation to Disney.

Joe found special joy in his grandchildren, whether cheering at a softball or soccer game,
