Mr. Cramer was born in New Haven December 18, 1937 son of the late William V. and Martha Sullivan Cramer, Sr. He retired after 41 years from the New Haven Police Dept. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus, Carmel Council. Lawrence was Policeman of the Year in 1969 for the rescue of a child and was awarded the Purple Cross by the NHPD for being wounded in the line of duty. He was also one of the longest serving Patrolman in NHPD history.
