Louise Cofrances Pellico, wife of Andrew L. Pellico, and daughter of Dr. Louis A. Cofrances and Rose Balsamo Cofrances, passed away peacefully on Thursday September 27, 2012 at the Masonicare Health Center. Louise graduated from Helen Street School, Hamden High School in 1949, and Larson College. She met Andrew on Valentine's Day in 1949, and they married in 1952. Louise leaves behind her loving husband of sixty years and three children: John Louis Pellico (Linda); Laura Pellico Prozano (Stephen), and Richard (Denise) Pellico; and eight grandchildren: Taryn, Dana and Alex (Prozano); Ryan and Katie (Pellico); and Tyler, Alex and Kevin (D'Errico).
