A lifelong learner, she attended classes at Quinnipiac College. She later earned her associate degree from the Academy of Business Careers in her mid-thirties, maintaining a 4.0 grade point average, allowing her to step into a successful career in bookkeeping. Known for her

exceptional work ethic, she was dedicated to her roles at Apple Health Care and the Mary Wade Home, never one to leave a task unfinished. Marilyn's vibrant spirit was evident in her love for music, especially rock and roll. She attended countless concerts by her favorite bands—Kiss, Led Zeppelin, Def Leppard, and Queen among them—and filled her home with the sounds of her favorite CDs. As Marilyn slowed down in her later years, she found joy in life's simple pleasures—sharing stories, savoring delicious meals, or enjoying the pampering care of her dear friend, Laura Caputo.
