Mark had a wonderful sense of humor and his laugh will be missed. His lifelong passion for learning will be carried on by his family.

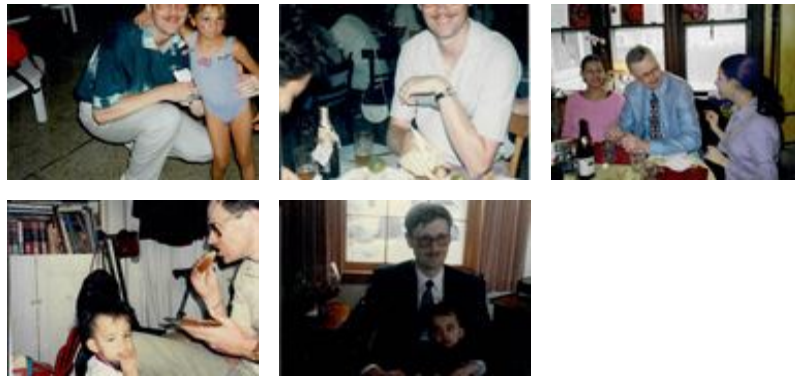
Due to the pandemic a Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at a later date in St. Aeden's Church, New Haven. Mark wished that donations go
