Mary Dolan Falvey, of Hamden died Sunday, July 1, 2012 at Harborside Healthcare Arden House, Hamden CT.

Mary was born in New Milford, Connecticut, December 8, 1920, daughter of the late Edward J. and Margaret Hyland Dolan. A graduate of New Milford High School, class of 1939 she attended Mount St. Vincent College in Riverdale, New York.

An accomplished musician, she studied voice in New York under the tutelage of Louis Shallioff performing in numerous vocal concerts throughout New England and entertaining many with her lyric soprano voice.

In 1953 she married the late Richard J. Falvey, a Yale man and the Assistant Vice President of the Second National Bank. Together they resided in the Spring Glen section of Hamden for many years and were members of the High Lane Club, the Quinnipiac Club and the Graduate Club.

She was employed by the Hamden Board of Education and was a member of the New Haven Womens Club, President of the St. Rita's Ladies Guild and volunteered as a docent at the Jonathan Dickerman House in Hamden.
