



Robert "Rip" Phipps

February 10, 1949 - November 21, 2024

Robert Gibson ("Rip") Phipps passed away on November 21, 2024 in the loving company of family and friends at the end of a courageous battle against cancer. Rip was born in New Castle PA on February 10, 1949 to Charles Phipps and Mary Louise Gibson Phipps Nolan. He graduated from New Castle High School and received a Bachelor of Architecture from Carnegie Mellon University in 1972, where he was involved in a number of community-oriented projects. He moved to New Haven after graduation, bringing with him his home-grown love of hot dogs and unwavering devotion to the Pittsburgh Steelers. While living in New Haven, Rip perfected Julia Child's recipe for French Onion Soup and honed his considerable skills as a self-employed cabinetmaker. His general curmudgeonly attention to detail, fascination with wood, and life-long love of studying architecture and design served him well in his profession. His sense of aesthetics, artistic talents, thoughtful nature, and commitment to restoration have been lovingly applied in his work, which graces many of the older buildings and homes in New Haven. He also designed and built custom furniture, distinctive for his incorporation of the Japanese and Arts and Crafts styles he admired.

He was predeceased by his parents and his beloved stepfather Thomas Nolan. He is survived by his wife, Patricia King and treasured daughter Margaret Phipps of New Haven, his dear sisters Sue Ellen (Craig) Collins of Asheville, NC and RuthAnn (Michael) Tyson of Hilton Head Island, SC, along with nieces and nephews and his canine companions, Hines, Ben and Lily. He

also leaves behind many, many, many books. Rip nurtured a large network of dear friends over the years through his collective living experiences, his pool league and his involvement as an integral part of a remarkable activity known as Summercamp. For more than 50 years Rip was instrumental in sustaining the success of an annual family camp in Mt Washington, MA. The enduring bonds developed among Summer campers span three generations and are responsible for a large network of deep friendships, including a circle of Rip's closest friends. Rip truly appreciated the gift of community and was an enthusiastic participant in numerous group activities. His passing will be mourned by many.
